Tuesday, June 14 (6:30pm) - Sunday, June 19, 2022 (12:00pm)

This retreat will explore the world as a "sacrament of communion" from the perspective of personal and planetary healing. The retreat is divided into two parts:

Part 1: Sister Marya Grathwohl will present Tuesday, June 14 (6:30pm)—Friday, June 17 (Noon)

"We are created in God's Goodness." Participants will prayerfully and playfully ponder themes of *Creation Spirituality* (And God saw that it all was good!) and *Cosmology* (Nothing is itself without everything else, Universe is a communion of subjects not a collection of objects, and Earth is primary, humanity is derivative.)

Part 2: Father Joe Nassal will present Friday, June 17, (3:00 pm)—Sunday, June 19 (Noon)

Drawing upon the insights and wisdom of *Laudato Si*, the participants will reflect on the communal act of reconciliation that reflects our commitment to care for the earth and each other. In the shelter of each other's compassion, in the challenge of each other's witness, we strive to be good stewards of creation and bring healing to our earth, ourselves and each other.

Sister Marya Grathwohl, OSF, served on the Leadership Team of her congregation, the Sisters of Saint Francis, Oldenburg, Indiana, for eight years. In 1998, she founded Earth Hope, which provides programs and retreats to "Care, Protect, and Restore Earth."
