Remembering Sister Valerie

Think of someone whose presence conveys love, sweetness, and peace. What does that person mean to you and your heart? For CASFA, *Love* and *Service* are the words that express the life of Sister Valerie Usher.



When the Franciscan Sisters of the Congregation of Our Lady of Lourdes arrived 38 years ago to establish our school in El Codito, Sister Valerie began a long history of service at CASFA. She moved to Bogotá to work with our families and children, driven by the desire to serve in the best Franciscan tradition.

Just a year after returning to the U.S., Sister Valerie died at Assisi Heights on Saturday, July 22, 2023. We are deeply grateful for her journey, as her presence among us was a gift — a light that radiated with the purity of charity and tenderness, a love that emanates from the gentle God, as she used to call Him.



The seeds of love that Sister Valerie planted in the hearts and lives she touched and inspired transcend time and space. Keeping this legacy alive and providing a space to embody her goodness at CASFA, we dedicated the Oratory in her honor. We want this space to be a refuge of safety for everyone in our community during times of doubt or distress. Since then, we have spent time in the Oratory with the youngest students, sharing stories about this woman who put her heart and soul into serving God.

Honoring Sister Valerie's life, we persist in working to foster love, joy, and a spirit of service in all those who are and will be a part of the miracle that CASFA represents.

To conclude, we ask you to think once more about that person you had in mind at the beginning of these words, the one who fills you with love and peace. Celebrating Saint Francis Day

We don't know if you've heard this story about the Chinese Bamboo Tree before, but it is a tale that inspired our celebration of Saint Francis Day this year.

Like any plant, the growth of the Chinese Bamboo Tree requires care: water, fertile soil, and sunlight. In its first year, we see no visible signs of change. In the second year, still there is no growth above the ground. In the third, fourth, fifth, and sixth year, still nothing. This might lead someone planting it for the first time to believe that all efforts are in vain. But finally, in the seventh year, behold, there is a miracle! We experience growth. many years, almost 40! Our roots have dug deep and have impacted the lives of many.

We have had to wait patiently, fertilize, and water the soil to see each of the dreamed of achievements – the first graduating class that successfully completed their studies, the acquisition of our own headquarters, the emergence of the orchestra and choir, the establishment of a computer room and science lab, and many more significant and small accomplishments that we sometimes overlook. In the day-to-day, it may seem like the steps are small, but looking back, we realize the long journey traveled and what we have built. In fact, we have our own magnolia tree that, for years, blooms with gigantic flowers in our yard and reminds us of this growth.

As a way to honor these roots, this year we held the Eucharist at the parish of Blessed Miguel de Rúa in the Codito neighborhood; the place where it all began and where most of the CASFA families live. As part of the celebration, we had the traditional Service Day, aiming to nurture the roots we have always sought to grow in the

hearts of our students and community: the vocation of service. This year, we went to different places in our neighborhood to serve our community. We went to gardens to share growing things with the children, to the neighborhood to pick up trash and paint murals, to nursing homes to care for the elderly, and engaged in many other activities. We ended the day with a great lunch that we all shared.

Valuing our roots was a way to connect with ourselves and to walk the path we seek to continue. We realized that love, enthusiasm, and the dreams of building a better society have shaped the history of CASFA. At the conclusion of our celebration, we reflected on the fact that all of us here today will
